

CASA REGALĂ A ROMÂNIEI, CĂSĂTORIILE DINASTICE ȘI IMPLICAȚIILE LOR POLITICE LA SFÂRȘITUL PRIMULUI RĂZBOI MONDIAL¹

Abstract: The post-World War I period turned out to be a transition for the Balkan monarchies. In this context, the Royal House of Romania, with a positive image after positioning on the Entente side, practices a matrimonial policy specific to the pre-war period, with direct influence on regional policy. What is observed in this context is that when the supporters of Venizelos, especially France, do not agree with the arrangement of the double marriage, Queen Mary speaks about the marriage of her children as a matter of private life, and when matters of major importance, the same Queen is totally different. The almost unanimous opinion of the diplomacy and press in the states involved in the geopolitics of the Balkans was that dynastic marriages are of political importance. The extensive diplomatic correspondence found in the archives based on this subject merely confirms this.
